At Fairfield, we use SCARF lessons to teach our RSHE lessons. SCARF provides a comprehensive scheme of work for RSHE education and covers all of the DfE's statutory requirements for Relationships Education and Health Education.

Transition Information



To help the transition process we gradually introduce the children to being moved between classes within their year groups.

Children will remain in their allocated class from EYFS (Reception) through to the end of Y2. This helps to provide children with a sense of security and supports wellbeing, as they will have familiar faces surrounding them as they move to a new classroom with a new teacher.

Children will be mixed from two classes to four classes as they move into Y3. This supports our new children joining us in Y3 from other infant schools and helps the children to make new friendships whilst celebrating a move into KS2.

Children will be mixed across classes within their year group at the start of Y5 and Y6. As we start to prepare our children to become secondary ready, children will be allocated into new classes in both Y5 and Y6. This helps to develop their social skills, forming new friendships with their peers, whilst gently preparing them to work collaboratively alongside different children.

*When moving into a new reorganised class, children will have an opportunity to select five friends they would like to be placed in a class with, teachers will work hard to ensure that at least one of the friends identified will be in their new class.

Letters will be sent on 23rd June, informing you of your child's new teacher and where their classroom will be.
